



DRESS CODE PROCEDURE

Belief

We believe that the wearing of a school uniform by children creates a feeling of belonging and pride throughout the school and community.

Girls:

- Navy polo Shirt—preferably with logo / school name
- Shorts—navy / bicycle pants
- Skort/Sports skirt—navy skirt
- Hat—broad brim or bucket
- Navy track-pants or leggings
- Approved school windcheater and/or plain navy jumper
- Summer dress is an option

Boys:

- Navy polo Shirt—preferably with logo / school name
- Shorts—navy
- Hat—broad brim, bucket or legionnaires
- Navy track-pants
- Approved school windcheater and/or plain navy jumper





GENERAL

- Broad brim or bucket style hat must be worn all year or students must be under shade during play periods.
- Covered shoes, sport shoes or sandals are acceptable footwear.
- Thongs, slip-ons, scuffs etc. are not acceptable for safety reasons.
- Any items of non-uniform clothing should, where possible must be plain and conform to the white and navy colours of the uniform.
- Samples of school uniform include polo's & windcheaters. Hats are available to view in the Front Office.
- Orders can be made on Uniform Days, which will be advertised through the Newsletter/ School Stream/ Facebook.
- In 2021 Year 6 & Year 7 students, and from 2022 Year 6 students, may purchase the leavers tops/jumpers which are designed by those students.

CHANGES TO THE UNIFORM

Requests for changes to the uniform can be made from Parent Club, the Student Representative Council, Staff or Governing Council. Any request will be considered by Governing Council which may also co-ordinate any community surveys as well as obtain and display uniform samples in collaboration with staff. Decisions about changes will be made by Governing Council once the school community has been consulted.
